SHOULD TWO ARCHERS TIE WITH THE SAME POINT SCORE, THEN THE AGGREGATE SCORE IS USED FOR THOSE ARCHERS ONLY TO AWARD A WINNER.

### **Youth Spirit Event**



The Inaugural ArcheryNSW Youth Series held in 2022 consisted of 4 events. Two target events, a field and clout event. The series was designed to encourage participation by our youth archers and to have events specifically for youths at low cost of entry fees.

The events consisted of:

The Armidale Youth Spirit Event (3 day event, Day 1 being a development day, day 2 and 3 being 24 target marked field). Coast Archers Youth Challenge consisting of all Canberra Rounds. Kidbow always a popular event with a Newcastle Round. This year we had 3

archers achieve a perfect score of 900, Alban Thornycroft, David Simcock (Coast) & Alyssa Mollema (Warringah). Finishing off with the Hawkeye Youth Clout hosted by Penrith City Archers. At these events ArcheryNSW provided each athlete with commemorative pins, that they can use at future events to swap.

For the purpose of this year's event, the Youth Spirit and Kidbow were handicapped with the Coast Archers Youth Challenge and Youth Clout using actual score shot.

20 points was awarded for the highest score for each event (*either recurve or compound*). 19 points for the second highest score and so forth... There are two perpetual trophies, one for recurve and one for compound, with no age / divisions or genders separating them. divisions or genders.

The trophies were handcrafted by Simon Zablotsky, a member of Westlakes and a skilled master craftsman. The trophies were carved from Australia Blackwood, from a tree hand selected to make the judicial benches for the Supreme Court in Sydney.
